Introduction

Congratulations on your purchase of a Traditional Tibet Tech® Prayer Wheel. Over twelve years of research and development went into the design of your Traditional Tibet Tech prayer wheel to ensure its reliable operation and spiritual blessings.

Your Traditional Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel is designed in a traditional Tibetan Buddhist style -- the housing being one that you might see in Nepal, India, or Tibet, often around monasteries and temples.

There are two models:

- A Table-Top model, recommended for indoor use only, with a finely-crafted brass finial on top and a white base that is 3D-printed on a Makerbot® Replicator® 2 Desktop 3D Printer.
- A Rack-Mounted model, that includes stainless steel posts at the bottom and top of the prayer wheel that fit into high quality UV resistant black Delrin Acetal Resin bearing blocks (for lubricity and wear resistance).

The design is elegant, providing a high quality and very functional Tibetan prayer wheel that will enhance your home or temple.

Prayer Wheels: An Antidote to Fear & Negativity

Your Tibet Tech prayer wheel is a powerful spiritual antidote to war, suffering, and negativity.

Tibet Tech prayer wheels are the first to use DVD optical disk storage technology. The largest prayer wheel in Old Tibet contained 100,000,000 prayers printed on paper with hand-carved wood blocks. Tibet Tech prayer wheels, created by Sakya Monastery of Tibetan Buddhism (www.sakya.org) in Seattle, Washington USA and Tibet Tech Prayer Wheels dwarf that, containing 84,348,750,000 to 1,349,580,000,000 prayers (depending on the number of DVDs in your Traditional Tibet Tech prayer wheel) in the form of Sanskrit mantras. As the prayer wheels are spun clockwise, Tibetan Buddhists believe that they radiate peace, kindness, and relief from suffering for all beings.


Buddhist texts teach that mindfully turning a prayer wheel produces the same merit and benefits as having recited the number of prayers (mantras) inside the prayer wheel multiplied by how many times the prayer wheel spins around. Each revolution of a Tibet Tech prayer wheel releases 1.3 trillion prayers. Doing the math, if you recited one prayer per second, it would take over 42,000 years to recite 1.3 trillion prayers!

His Holiness Jigdal Dagchen Sakya Dorje Chang, one of the revered Tibetan Buddhist leaders, oversaw the design and construction of Tibet Tech prayer wheels. Sakya leaders hold a position third only to His Holiness the Dalai Lama in rank. All the DVDs used in Tibet Tech prayer wheels have been blessed and consecrated by a Sakya leader: H.H. Jigdal Dagchen Sakya, H.E. Avikrita Sakya, or H.E. Dagmo Kusho Sakya. H.H. Jigdal Dagchen Sakya Dorje Chang has said that "as long as the Universe exists, the consecrated prayers will remain potent."


Prayer Wheel Benefits, Based on Tibetan Buddhist Teachings

- Blesses and purifies your body, speech and mind.
- Transforms your home and property into a very peaceful "Heaven on Earth."
- One of the easiest ways to purify past negative karma and nonvirtuous actions.
- Helps you realize your true self and understand the true nature of reality.
- Prevents beings (e.g., other people and animals) in the area from rebirth in the lower realms.
- Accumulates extensive merit for oneself and family.


How to Assemble the Traditional Table-Top Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel



1. Carefully unpack the center base, dust shield, 3/8" SS ball, white circular ball bearing, and four base support legs.




2. Slide the four base support legs into the four slots on the center base. Adjust the legs so that the stand sits level on your table or stand.



3. Insert the 3/8" SS ball into the center base. It will fit in a hole in the very bottom of the center base.



4. Insert the 1.375" white circular ball bearing in the top of the center base so that you can see the circle of small stainless steel ball bearings (i.e., facing up).



5. Insert the dust shield over the top of the bearing.

Note: Make sure the white ball bearing and yellow dust shield are flush with the top of the base.



6. Unpack the prayer wheel and insert the shaft at the bottom of the prayer wheel into the hole in the center of the dust shield. The prayer wheel is heavy and it is a tight fit so insert it slowly and carefully until it is fully seated in the base. Note: The prayer wheel will be sealed with silicone and is not designed to be opened.

Spin the prayer wheel clockwise mindfully with the intention and prayer: "May all beings be happy. May all beings be free from suffering."


How to Assemble the Traditional Rack-Mounted Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel

1. Unpack the black Delrin Acetal Resin upper and lower mounting bearings, as well as the 3/8" SS ball. Also, unpack the prayer wheel itself. The prayer wheel is sealed with silicone and is not designed to be opened.





Bottom Bearing Block

Height from bottom of lower bearing block to top of upper bearing block: 16.5"

2. Insert the 3/8" SS ball in the lower bearing. Using the predrilled holes, mount the upper bearing and lower bearing so that the prayer wheel will sit perfectly vertical in a fixed rack.

Dimensions:

- Height: 16.5"
- Diameter: 12.125"

Note: The Traditional Rack-Mounted Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel is not freestanding. Mounting hardware and rack are not provided. Photos of traditional prayer wheel racks can be seen here: <http://ow.ly/Jt4yh>



Spin the prayer wheel clockwise mindfully with the intention and prayer: "May all beings be happy. May all beings be free from suffering."

Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel Prayers

All the prayers in each Tibet Tech prayer wheel have been blessed and consecrated. His Holiness Jigdal Dagchen Sakya Dorje Chang has said that "as long as the Universe exists, the consecrated prayers will remain potent."

On the top of the DVD stack inside the copper cylinder is a red circular laminated paper cover (topper) with a mandala of the *Om Mani Padme Hum* mantra in the center. The mandala was painted by Lama Migmar, a monk who is Sakya Monastery of Tibetan Buddhism's resident artist. On the other side of the topper is the Sky Wheel Mandala in color.

Each Tibet Tech prayer wheel includes [DVDs with eight magical and powerful prayers](#) (Sanskrit mantras). The prayers are stacked from the bottom up, starting with the A-li mantra; then the Ka-li mantra, and so on up to the eighth mantra, the 100-syllable Vajrasattva mantra.

On the bottom of the DVD stack is another circular laminated paper cover. Facing up is the Earth Wheel Mandala in color. The outlines of the Earth and Sky Wheel Mandalas were drawn by Lama Zopa Rinpoche¹, following the instructions of the Fourth Panchen Lama.

Tibet Tech Products

1. **A Hand-held Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel**. The hand-held Tibet Tech prayer wheel includes: a hard maple handle with walnut stain; a stack of 8-DVDs that contain 84,348,750,000 prayers; and a brass arm with a clear crystal weight.
2. **A Clear Plastic Hand-held Prayer Wheel Holder** designed specifically to support the Tibet Tech hand-held prayer wheel in a vertical position.
3. **An African Mahogany Hand-held Prayer Wheel Holder** designed specifically to support the Tibet Tech hand-held prayer wheel in a vertical position.
4. **A “Two-In-One” Electric Table-Top Prayer Wheel** for continuous and automatic operation. This table-top prayer wheel includes: an electric drive unit; a stack of 8-DVDs that contain 84,348,750,000 prayers; one crystal finial and one brass post; one Medicine Buddha DVD; a brass collar to position the DVD on the brass post; and an AC/DC adapter.
5. **1-DVD Solar-powered Tibet Tech Prayer Wheels** that include: A solar-powered turntable and one DVD filled with prayers. The DVD has a crystal finial on top. Choose from: Medicine Buddha, Chenrezi (*Om Mani Padme Hum*), Tara, Amitayus, Padmasambhava, Manjushri, and Vajrakilaya.
6. **An 8-DVD Solar-powered Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel** that includes: A solar-powered turntable and a stack of 8-DVDs with a crystal finial on top.
7. **A Traditional Table-Top Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel** that sits on a table and is turned by hand. It optionally contains 8, 32, 64 or 128 DVDs.
8. **A Traditional Rack-Mounted Tibet Tech Prayer Wheel** that is designed to be installed in a rack as typically found around temples and monasteries. It optionally contains 8, 32, 64 or 128 DVDs. (Rack not included.)
